NZIF introduces...

Forest Policy Project Chair Garth Cumberland



Garth Cumberland was schooled in Auckland and graduated from Massey University with an Agricultural Science degree in 1964. Now *well* retired, Garth is a Fellow of both the New Zealand Institute of Agricultural Science and New Zealand Institute of Forestry.

Following completion of Massey studies in 1964, he was awarded a position as a Field Research Scientist for the Government's (then)
Department of Agriculture. He undertook an array of practical research work and collaborated with members of Ruakura Research Station and the Farm Advisory Divisions. Notable agriculture-orientated projects include the Otakanini fertilizer grazing trial on West Coast sands and, in conjunction with FRI staff, the inter-relationships of pasture, trees and animals in agroforestry.

Garth Cumberland continued

In the 70s and 80s he managed his family's forest and farming investments which included horticulture, dairying, goats, beef, sheep and agroforestry. Spin-off activities included businesses in the fields of animal breeding, wool processing and timber marketing.

From the late 80s until retiring in 2012, he established and managed a forestry consultancy providing investment and management services to forest industry investors; mostly families and professional groups and partnerships based about the northern part of the North Island.

Since 2012 he has 'worked at' and enjoys glorious retirement. In that capacity Garth has as yet unsuccessfully applied himself to seeking professional opportunities in petanque, kayak fishing and Gold Card touring using public transport. The capricious extremes of his enthusiasm require full-time restraint by Vivienne and Bruno.

Garth's strong support for the NZIF Forest Policy Project arises from a belief that the forest sector has a barrelful of benefits for the New Zealand economy and the Global environment but this fact of life appears not to have permeated the sanctums of our bewildered leaders.
