- 1. Purposes of forest valuation,
- 2. Methods of forest valuation,
- 3. Standard method for forest valuation,
- 4. Standards for forest description and
- associated guidance notes, 5. Valuation presentation standards,
- 6. Valuation checklist,
- 7. Glossary of terms.

The purpose of releasing these discussion drafts is to seek feedback and comment from a wide range of interested parties. This information will be used to revise the discussion draft. The revised document will be subsequently released as an exposure draft.

The Working Party is very keen for members to be involved with the further development of the forest valuation guidelines.

## **Indigenous forests review**

A small working group to review the policy of the Institute on indigenous forestry met in September. John Holloway, Colin O'Loughlin, Alan Reid and Dave Field are reporting to NZIF Council on their initial views on developing a new policy. They believe that the present situation concerning administration, legislation and management of our native forests has developed in a piecemeal and uncoordinated way. Presently, quite separate statutes (Resource Management Act, Con-

servation Act, Forests Amendment Act) determine how native forests must be managed, but there is no overall philosophy or linkages in the controls.

The review group will suggest to Council that it is time to go back to first principles in developing native forest policy, so that the true value of our forests and the opportunities they embrace can be understood by Government and the public. Forests are now recognised for their importance in biodiversity, global climate and sheer human survival. New Zealand forests have significant virtues and potential but their present administration and management doesn't necessarily reflect all possibilities.

If Council agrees with the general direction of thoughts from the review group, then specific details will be addressed and the ideas and support of other Institute members will be sought.
